Since 2009, Emily Landis Walker has provided expert consulting services through Landis & Co. with a focus on CEO and Board Advisory for financial institutions and international corporations as well as capital-raising. She is currently advising Mint Executive – a UK based Close Protection and Security Advisory firm.

During 2014 and 2015, Emily worked with OCSiAL, - a global nanotechnology company producing Single Walled Carbon Nanotubes - and Ujet S a.r.l - a nanotech based urban transport company, to raise capital globally for these start-up firms..

She serves on the Executive Advisory Committee of the Global Roundtable, New York University's International Centre for Emergency Preparedness (InterCEP) and on the Board of Trustees for the UK-based charity for the Cross-Sector Safety and Security Communications (CSSC) Partnership.

Previously Emily served for seven years on the Advisory Board to London First's Security and Resilience Network. Emily was also a member of the US Technical Assistance Group to ISO TC 223, assisting in the development of international standards for societal security ISO 22301 published in June 2012.

She also served as an Advisor to Simudyne, a company that creates, develops and produces enterprise modelling and simulation software solutions to manage and solve

complex business and organizational issues.

Emily served as a Distinguished Visiting Fellow at the Homeland Security Institute and was a member of the Department of Homeland Security Private Sector Senior Advisory Committee and Quadrennial Review Advisory Committee.

In 2008, Emily served as Head of Corporate Affairs for Barclays Global Retail and Commercial Bank (GRCB) based in London. Prior to that, she spent 15 years with Citibank/Citigroup as a Managing Director in Emerging Markets Corporate Banking, Retail and Institutional Asset Management, Traveler's Life and Annuity, and Global Wealth Management. She was heavily involved in the merger integration of Citi and Travelers.

During 2006, she was seconded by Citigroup to the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) in Rome to launch an Emergency Network. From 2003 to 2004 she served on the "9-11 Commission" as Professional Staff Member and Family Liaison.

Emily represented the United States on the Board of the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD) in London at its inception in 1991. From 1989 to 1990 she served as Executive Secretary to the US Secretary of the Treasury, Nicholas Brady. She also worked for 8 years at the International Monetary Fund.

Emily is a dual UK/US national and has degrees from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies.

Emily speaks regularly in diverse forums in the US and abroad. She has also been an active political commentator, appearing on many radio and television broadcasts. She was instrumental in the creation of the first international political action committee American Voices International in

order to facilitate Americans abroad registering to vote and chairs panels on international topics.
